Mid-Ohio Show Report

The 48th Mid-Ohio show held during the first weekend of November (Nov. 4-6) in Springfield, Ohio drew a huge crowd. Club members that I remember seeing at the show included Dave Shaw, Russ & Marge Frank, Rick Soller, Bob Stahr, Arlen & Tina Rienstra, Les & Judy Christensen, Jason Townsend, Dave & Josephine Ramp, Josh Dondorf, Mike & Deb Fowler, Richard Case, Mark Gilmore, Kim Borgman & Daughter, and John Weber. The 379 photographs of the show posted on insulators.com indicate the popularity of the show.

Dealing started early on Friday. Collectors and show hosts set to work to get the show ready to go on Friday morning with a goal of opening the doors at noon. A faster set-up resulted in people getting in and starting the fun earlier.

Displays were disappointing this year. Usually there are quite a few but this year there were only 9 competitive and 1 community display. Four of the competitive displays were by GCIC members. Richard Case had three insulators that had been turned on a lathe into the shape of glass insulators. Arlen Rienstra had an assortment of CD 154s from different manufacturers. Les Christensen's display consisted of a map of the United States and commemoratives from national shows from around the country. Rick Soller brought ugly and unusual insulators from his collection. Rick also coordinated the community display of solid pour insulators with contributions from Rick, Bob Stahr, Russ Frank, Dennis & Jeanne Weber, Dwayne Anthony, and Bill Rohde.

On Friday night after the show closed, an auction was held. It was a little smaller than in the past but had some quality items at prices that were reasonable. A large Reddy Kilowatt sign stood out the most but better pieces included an aqua CD 269 Jumbo, purple CD 194/195 Hemingray 54A&B, numerous power Pyrex pieces, and a light aqua CD 317 Chambers. I kept a list of the prices realized but could not find it when I was writing this. Marge Frank did a great job of helping out during the auction by holding up pieces, walking around with them, and taking them to the winner bidder. She didn't drop a single insulator!



Ray Klingensmith also had the equivalent of auction at his tables. He had set up lots of about 16 insulators and took "sealed" bids for each lot. Most of the lots had something interesting in them. I ended up with two of them. One included a couple mine insulators that I did not have. They were unthreaded mine insulators so are not included in the porcelain pintype insulator book. The other box lot had some slip cast insulators that fit a small collection of these that I own.

Naturally there were quite a few negotiations held at the show. Jason Townsend had multiple tables of insulators that he was intent to completely sell. By Saturday afternoon, he succeeded by making two deals with Rick Soller. Rick bought two tables of common insulators in the first deal and two more tables of insulators in the second deal. Rick then did some cherry picking of a couple boxes of insulators and then sold the rest of them to a couple other collectors. Since the show, many of these were listed on the for sale page in the picture poster section of insulators.info.

On Saturday night, there was a hospitality room at the hotel. James Brancroft (from England) wondered how many "litres" of ale were consumed there and, while the actual amount is not known, it was sure to be a lot.

While the show was going on, in the adjoining building there was an auction of cars and car parts. Bob Stahr brought to my attention that one of the early model cars had a glass ashtray of the type that is frequently confused for an insulator. In addition, the sick shift had a glass knob of the same type of swirled milk glass.

I brought a few insulators to the show given to me by Joan Crandall. Noted multipart collector Justin Perrault was in the parking lot when I was unloading and I quickly realized he would be the perfect recipient for Joan's insulators. In the picture below, you can see how happy Justin was to get this three-part sub-station piece.
