Dear Members.

As you know, several months have passed since the NIA name change proposal was made at Herkimer N.Y.. The total membership has been polled in this regard, and although response has been relatively light, a 5 to 1 ratio has voted against the suggested change. Based on this, the Board of Directors have decided our organization name will remain the National Insulator Association with the recommendation that "antique" insulators be stressed in future show advertising to help increase attendance by the uninformed public.

NIA By-laws, Article II, Far. 4, provides that the Board of Directors by majority vote of approval may award Life Member ship to any member for meritorious service to the NIA or the insulator collecting hobby- with no more than two per year to b awarded. Since the 'Family Membership' went into effect in 1979 (at\$6.00), and since its common knowledge that the recipient's spouse, through work, patience and cooperation, contributed to the partners receipt of the life membership, your Board has vot to extend full privileges, including voting, to all past and future recipient's spouses.

The Board has also approved the establishment of a Dr. Fred Griffin Memorial Award in memory and recognition of a truly fine gentleman and our first NIA President. This distinctive award will be given by the NIA at each national show for the most outstanding threadless display. This will give all of you threadless collection and added incentive to try even harder!

The next 'Drip Points' will contain ballots for voting- not only for the offices of NIA President and Western VP, but also t important changes the Board is advocating. One is the re-alighnme of the Western and Central regions with the proposal that Colora

and New Mexico be moved from the Central to the Western region. Reason is based on previous and present proposals of geographic cosideration and the desire of members to be a part of the regi with which they have been historically associated. The second change proposes that the length of office term of the President be extended from one year to two years, effective the election of 1982. Reason for this would be the continuity of office, the utilization of gained experience, and the economic benefits the would be derived.

I'm mentioning the above now to give all voting members a chance to study the proposals before the ballots arrive. Most important is the reminder that only current paid-up members are eligible to vote, so if you have not paid your dues- DO IT NOW!

Last but not least is the reminder that our mailings of 'Drip Points", membership cards, etc. go Third Class Mail and as such will not be forwarded by the Postal Service. Therefore it is imperative that you notify our Treasurer (Shirley Patocka if you have moved, or you contemplate doing so.

Till next time, good luck in your collecting and I'll expect to see you all in Sacramento in July- it'll be a great show!

FROM THE HISTORIAN

Dear NIA Members,

Alan Rodgers had reported the history of the NIA up through the 7th National which was in the summer issue of 'Drip Points' in 1977 - Vol. 4. No. 4.

THE EIGTH NATIONAL

The Lakeland Florida Civic Center was the site of the NIA's 8th annual Convention and Show and Sale. Eager collectors began

arriving on Wednesday to settle at the Hilton Inn, which was designated as the NIA's host hotel. The preparation that was made by the show hosts, Len and Jackie Linscott, and Bob Alexander, was very evident.

On opening day collectors from all parts of the U.S. and Canada were busy buying, selling, and trading insulators and related items. The NIA General Membership meeting was held on Friday night. The following officers for the coming year were announced- President; John McDougald; Eastern Region Vice-President; Alan Rodgers. Appointed were: Carol McDougald, Treasurer; Rick Jones, Information Director; and Jim White; Executive Director. After the business meeting collectors gathered at the show hosts hospitality room for drinks and insulator talk, lasting until the early hours of the morning.

Saturday was busy, and climaxed with a buffet banquet at the Hilton Inn. Life Memberships were awarded to Dr. Fred Griffin, Dennis McHenry, Ray Bryan, Bill Dreggors, and Ernest Rostock. The Cutstanding Service Award was presented to Gerald and Esta Brown.

Sunday saw collectors making the final decisions of what to buy, and the final good-by's were said with the thought of next years National in everyones mind.

THE NINTH NATIONAL

The ninth NIA Show and Sale was held in Reno, Nevada on July 21, 22 and 23rd 1978. Keith and Ann Ornbaum, with the assistance of Don and Dora Harned and Bill and Karen Galloway, staged the show in the new Reno Centennial Coliseum.

Friday set the pace of the show, with threaded and threadless glass changing hands by the treasure trove. The NIA General Meeting was held in a room at the Convention Center on Friday just after the close of the day's show. New officers were announced with Len Linscott taking over the Presidents duties. Pat Patocka was elected as Western region Vice-President

Saturday morning the Board of Directors met and took positive action on the issue of NIA Members only being allowed to sell and display at the National Shows.
