DIRECTIONS:

BIBLE LIFE CHURCH, 2510 Gumtree Rd., Winston-Salem, NC 27107

Gray building with a bright blue roof, next to the fire department. Sign out front says Bible Life Church.

If coming from the WEST:

Travel East on Interstate 40 into Winston Salem;

Freeway splits into BUS40 and 140. Stay to the right on 140;

You will see signs for 140 GREENSBORO. (Continue onto 140 for 5.4 miles);

Take HWY 52 South to LEXINGTON. (You'll be on Hwy. 52 for 7 miles);

Take the HICKORY TREE exit. Go left on Hickory Tree, which dead-ends into old Hwy. 52 (S. Main St.)

Take a left on old Hwy. 52 and go ½ mile

Turn right onto GUMTREE ROAD. Stay on Gumtree Road for 4.5 miles. You are there!

If coming from the EAST:

Travel West on Interstate 40 and you will see signs for GREENSBORO.

When you get to GREENSBORO, stay on I-40 W and follow signs to Winston-Salem;

As you get close to WINSTON-SALEM, take the HWY. 52 SOUTH exit to Lexington;

You will be on Hwy. 52 South for 7 miles;

Take the HICKORY TREE exit and go right on Hickory Tree Road which dead-ends into old Hwy. 52, (South Main Street);

Take a left onto old Hwy. 52 and go ½ mile;

Turn right onto GUMTREE ROAD. Stay on Gumtree Road 4.5 miles. You are there!

If coming from the SOUTH:

Travel north on I-85. When you are about 40 miles north of Charlotte, NC start looking for HWY. 52 NORTH to WINSTON-SALEM/LEXINGTON exit:

Take that exit and continue North on HWY. 52 for 23 miles.

Take the HICKORY TREE exit, and go right on Hickory Tree Road, which deadends into old Hwy. 52 (South Main Street);

Take a left onto old Hwy. 52 and go ½ mile;

Turn right onto GUMTREE ROAD. Stay on Gumtree Road 4.5 miles. You are there!
