## San Jose, CA National Show Report

San Jose, California is pretty far away from Chicago but several club members still managed to attend the 42<sup>nd</sup> annual National Insulator Association Show, Sale, & Convention at the Doubletree Hotel. Gene Hawkins (pictured below on the right) arrived at the show first since he has relatives in the area. He was at the show the weekend before and enjoyed many local activities including attending the area flea market. I heard one local collector compliment Gene on the public relations he did at the flea market as he spent a lot of time talking about insulators and the show to everyone who would listen. Oddly enough, Gene managed to pick up several K.C.G.W. insulators at the show, one from club member Rick Soller who got the insulator at the show. I guess the California collectors don't know how great they are.

Gene was also kept busy at the show because he was in charge of judging of the displays. This meant, among other things, that he had to compile the results of the judges and prepare the trophies for the displays. Most display awards were announced at 1:30 on Saturday so Gene had to work fast.





Bob Stahr (above left) took a late Wednesday night plane to the show so he could spend as much time at home as possible with his almost 2-year-old son, Grant, and his cheerful wife, Stacy. But he had an 8:30 a.m. Board meeting on Thursday morning and, as the first past president, he managed to do that too. The Board meeting went to sometime past 3 p.m. (a record for the length of a Board meeting) and Bob still looked awake at the end. Bob bought some great

bargains at the show (purple ponies, cobalt signals) and sold some of them but will have some on his table at future shows. Bob also used slow time during the show to add more information to the Insulator Gazette. There are now more than 11,000 articles on insulators in the Gazette, a huge number due to the work of Bob.

Bob left California early Sunday morning so missed the excitement surrounding the walk-in of two purple CD 701 "eggs." One was essentially mint and the other VNM. When the eggs got to the show, Gene Hawkins was working the desk outside the show hall where free appraisals were given. Rick Soller was thanking Colin Jung, one of the show hosts, at the time so heard about the eggs as someone came in to tell Colin about them. He followed Colin out to the appraisal table and was about the third person to see them before word spread through the show hall and a large crowd gathered around them. Rick was also the underbidder on both pieces with the mint one sold to Terry Drollinger via Gil Hedges-Blanquez for \$2000 and the VNM one sold to Dwayne Anthony for \$1700.

Jason Townsend made a brief appearance on Friday and quickly sold a massive number of boxes with inserts to collectors. He has business in the area for the next several weeks so did not stay for the rest of the show.

Rick Soller left Chicago at about 10 a.m. and arrived in San Jose about 12:40 p.m. local time. The 2 hour time difference worked in his favor. He only took one insulator to the show to sell but it was a Bennington threadless that was purchased by Jack Riesselman for \$5500. He also brought a display consisting of a small salesman's sample that he purchased at an antique store on the way back from last year's national. During the show, he managed to purchase quite a few foreign porcelain pieces including a no-tie from England, a Japanese piece with Mickey Mouse ears, and a table of common white porcelain. Below is the insulator shown in Rick's display (on right) and the display itself showing 2 ads from the company, a comparison of the insulator to a Fred Locke miniature, and other information.





At the banquet, Rick was honored with Lifetime Membership in the NIA. This award was based on his service to the NIA as Historian for 10 years and Executive Director for 2 years before that plus his service as editor of the GCIC Newsletter for 17 of the 19 years of the club, and the editor of the Northwest Insulator Club newsletter. He has also published articles in the CJ, displayed at numerous shows, and given insulator presentations to thousands of students at the college he teaches at.

The club award was won by Justin & Wendy Martin, of Butte, MT. The award consisted of a line drawing of two old-time linemen standing on a crossarm atop a pole with two-piece Muncies adorning the pins. The Martin's display included a light box with 35 power insulators. Surrounding the box were two old, small transformers. The award was a good one for Justin and Wendy since the two part Muncies were used in Montana.

There were actually several displays in competition for the club award for Best Use of Power Insulators. John Contreres had a display with a 3 crossarm pole in the center filled with gutter top multiparts, medium voltage insulators, and transpositions on the bottoms. Conductors were tied to all the insulators and birds were perched on them. Sand was placed at the base of the pole and various other critters were added to the scene. Steve Marsh had a display of Hemingray power insulators showing an amazing line-up of the insulators. Paul Greaves and Mike Spadafora had insulators from the Locke dump showing odd glazes and deformities.

Next year the national will be in Kansas City, Kansas. Show hosts are Daryl Wagner and Charles Brandon.
