What's been going on

National Show Report

The June 22-24, 2012 National show in Kansas City, Missouri is in the books now. It sounds like everyone had a great time. I heard a lot of good things about the fireworks display and several club members got to see the enormous collection of Charles Brandon.

The club was well-represented amongst the displayers at the show. We should be proud that so many of the displays were put on by the club since the show was quite a distance away and putting together a display requires a great deal of effort.

Each year the club sponsors an award for the best use of power insulators used in a display. The award includes original art work professionally matted and framed. This year the award was won by Ron Yuhas for his display of colorful power insulators. Below on the left is a picture of the award.



Richard Case had three displays at the show. He recreated the Insulbug for the show using a "submarine" insulator, a hogs liver porcelain insulator and a few other pieces. A picture of the insulbug is shown above on the right. Richard's second display was on the amber Hemingray D-518 spools that were used on a pole at the end of his driveway that finally came down in a storm. His third display was on the Scott C. Cutter insulator. Some of you may have seen this display at the Yorkville, Illinois show.

Jason Townsend put together a noncompetitive display of porcelain Mickey Mouse insulators. Included in the display were several rare blue porcelain insulators and the rarest white insulator. Club members contributing to the display included Richard Case, Rick Soller, and Tim Haraf. Elton Gish, Matt Grayson, and Stanley Klein also contributed.

Roger Lucas did a display of glass from the Hemingray factory dump. The display was titled “Anomalies of Glass and Why They Exist.”

Arlen Rienstra’s display titled “Hemingray Blue & Ball Blue Too, It’s All in the Sand!” won several awards at the show. It received the NIA award for Best of Color and it also received the NIA Milholland Educational Award.

Russ Frank put together an extensive display of reproduction insulators. I believe the display included 29 different kinds of reproductions including those made by Mark Lauckner, William McLaughlin, the Telephone Pioneers of America, Bill Scandarioto, Eric Johnson, and many others.



Columbia City, Indiana Show Report
