

Racine, Wisconsin Swap Meet Report

I was originally going to write a scathingly negative report about this show. I showed up early in the afternoon on Saturday, perfect weather welcoming me, and there was no one there. Then I found out I was a week early for the show. Luckily this gave me a chance to drop off some stuff and bring more six days later.

This was the 15th annual GCIC "end of summer" swap meet held by Randy Wesner in Racine, Wisconsin. Although there was rain in the area the day before, the day of the show the weather was cool and sunny. Food this year consisted of Italian sausage, brats, hot dogs, potato salad, potato chips, baked beans, raw vegetables (carrots, celery), pickles, miniature chocolate cupcakes, cookies, pastries in the morning, and various beverages.

Tina Rienstra inspired a number of great ideas during the after show socializing. She wondered how the crowd at this swap meet compared to the previous one (I think there were more this year) which led several club members to suggest that the club should have a position of secretary to compile such information. I believe Mike Fowler nominated Tina for the position and it seemed that Russ Frank seconded the motion. A call for a vote ensued and Tina was approved for the position by all those present. We'll have to see if the vote stands up to a court challenge. There was also admiration showered on Bill and LaVonne Sharp for the North Western Insulator Club tee shirts they were wearing. Someone remarked that it would be nice if our club had tee shirts which led to a discussion of who had clothing merchandising and purchasing experience. Once again, Tina's name came up, was nominated for the position, the nomination quickly seconded, and a unanimous vote cast. Unfortunately, Tina turned down both positions.

Seven sellers had items in the auction for sale. Les Christianson had a single item and Dennis Seltrecht placed two lots in the auction but the rest of the sellers brought quite a bit of stuff to sell. Wayne Elmer's insulators occupied three tables since he was getting rid of the last of his collection. Almost of all of Wayne's insulators were porcelain and included quite a few multiparts. Although Wayne could not make it to the show, Rick Soller was kind enough to pick them up in Beloit and bring them to the show. Rick had about two tables of insulators consisting of mostly glass. Mike McLaughlin had 7 lots in the auction which included some oddball pieces such as a round third rail insulator, an insulator cut in half, and some blue J-D suspensions. Dave Shaw's 12 insulator lots were the cleanest and came in white, pristine boxes with dividers which certainly drove the price higher. Arlen Rienstra brought bushel baskets of insulators that looked fresh out of a collection. Most of the insulators were glass and several baskets had some surprises in them.

Because there were some many multiparts in the auction, many of those in Wayne's collection were sold before the auction to insure a fair price since, with so few multipart collectors, there was concern that they would not sell for much. As a result, the listing of items

sold in the auction also includes many of the pre-auction sales that were observed. \$351 worth of items were sold in pre-auction deals.

The auction itself netted the club \$62 in commissions on \$622 in sales. This was less than in previous years, probably due to all the porcelain for sale rather than glass. Porcelain generally sells for less than glass. There were also fewer expensive lots. The top lot was one of the first for a multipart "tic" which sold for \$55. The top lots with multiple insulators sold for \$34, \$30, \$26, \$25, \$23, and \$21. Most lots seemed to sell in the \$1 to \$9 range.
