

Racine, Wisconsin Swap Meet Report

Despite the threat of rainy weather, a good crowd made it to the Saturday, September 10, 2016 GCIC swap meet hosted by Randy Wesner in Racine, Wisconsin. Randy, who, with numerous previous swap meets under his belt, was well prepared with a tent, and plenty of food.

An interesting group of collectors graced the crowd. Former Racine residents Shirley and Chuck Robinson made the long drive from the St. Louis area. Seldom-seen collector Ed Peters came down from Manasha, Wisconsin, north of Milwaukee. Bruce and Sharon Laughlin, new members of the club, enjoyed the day amongst fellow collectors. Club president Bob Stahr made a brief visit with his wife, Stacey, and growing future collector Grant. I had not seen Tom Underwood from Oshkosh in a while so it was nice to be reminded of what he looked like. There were also the usual suspects and a few other new faces including Larry Beauchamp, Deb Reed-Fowler, Mike Fowler, Russ Frank, Marge Frank (some kind of relationship), Arlen Rienstra, Tina Rienstra, Dean Raymond, Dieter Holz, some guy named Austin who was there with his mom, Marna, and Marna's mom, Gene Hawkins, Iowa Dennis Seltrecht, Indiana Mike McLaughlin, South Dakota Riley Armstrong, Illinois Rick Soller, tall Richard Case, Justin "multipart" Perault, Karen Palmowski, Jason Palmowski, Steve Mattson, Jim Hoffman, Gary Glover, a dog, someone named Martin, and Peter Ledinski. I missed a few names but the estimate was that there were 39 or 40 people there, 1 dog, and several squirrels.

Oddly enough, I have crossed paths with the Laughlin's twice before recently even though I only just learned about their involvement in the hobby. The first time was when Sharon called out of the blue looking for an insulator to buy for her husband's birthday. She settled on a cobalt blue Russian insulator and we completed the deal at my house a few days later when I also let her know about the Racine swap meet. A little while later, I was at an estate sale that advertised an insulator collection of a large number of insulators. I was in the first group that got in the door and bought a couple doorknobs (sold them in the auction for a \$15 profit), a Kim Borgman specialty (CD 106 [230] Hemingray / No 9 smooth base which I sold on Facebook for a small profit), and a couple other pieces. Most of the other insulators were extremely overpriced (clear CD 257 Mickey Mouse for \$100). Nevertheless, I went back the next day to make sure I didn't overlook anything and because I thought everything was half price (turned out to be only 25% off since there was one more day to go). During this second trip, I met Bruce when we were both pawing through a table of insulators. While talking to him, I found out that he didn't live far from me and then the chips started to fall into place as the realization occurred that he was the one for whom I sold an insulator to his wife. I reminded him of the swap meet too.

A second interesting person at the show was Gary Glover. He is a young lineman (think Tim Haraf if you have been in the club long enough) who had a bunch of insulators brought home from "work." It was fun explaining to him what to look for when he is out in the field in the future. He put the insulators in the auction and saw the 6 lots sell for \$36.

Most of the quantity of insulators came from Josh Dondorf via Rick Soller. Josh listed them on eBay with a starting bid of \$100 and sold them for \$150 although the buyer backed out. I was the second highest bidder and agreed to buy them. My original plan was to take them to the Muncie National and put them on the free table but I had so much other material for the National, I wasn't able to fit anything else in the pickup. A couple days before the show, I picked a truckload up with Josh's help to load them and brought them to Racine. The night before, Riley Armstrong and Austin helped clean some of them up with a little water. Altogether, I picked up about 35 crates of insulators which I estimate equaled about 1,000 insulators. I left at least that many behind in Hinkley, Illinois so if anyone is interested in them, contact Josh before he has to unwillingly throw them in a dumpster. I'm pretty sure I lost money on the deal but I am happy they didn't end up in a landfill and I did find two porcelain wire holders for my collection.

There were many other insulators and go-withs at the show that were much better. Arlen Rienstra had an interesting wall bracket that held three insulators, and Dennis Seltrecht had a rare CD 190/191 transposition in a grayish color. There was a green CD 206 castle on one dealer's table and Riley Armstrong brought a huge line post in a crate. A couple CD 257 Mickey Mouse



insulators adorned another table. These were greenish, caused by amber mixing in with the aqua. I also remember a long porcelain wall tube, some Surge side pins, LSV commemoratives, and colorful CD 162 signals on various tables.

The commission on items sold in the auction plus donations paid for a big chunk of the cost of the swap meet. \$1028.75 worth of insulators and related goods was sold netting \$98.55 in commissions and \$51.45 in money via donations for a total of \$150. The most expensive insulator in the auction, a threadless glass egg, sold for \$390 with the next most expensive lot going for \$45. Sellers included Mike McLaughlin, Rick Soller, Russ Frank, Ed Peters, Steve Mattson, Mike Fowler, Larry Beauchamp, Gene Hawkins, Riley Armstrong, and Gary Glover.
