Strongsville, Ohio Show Report

Even though the Strongsville, Ohio Winterfest and the Crown Point, Indiana "Beat the Winter Blahs" Swap Meet are separated by only five hours of driving (322 miles) that is almost all on the interstate, there is little overlap in dealers who set up at the show or collectors who attend. Since the two shows are only a week apart, that may explain why all but the most dedicated collectors attend both. This year I planned to attend both shows.

Early indications were that the Saturday, January 19, 2019 Winterfest swap meet would feature 10 dealers from 5 different states: Illinois (Rick Soller), Michigan (Andy Wadysz), New York (Ken Willick), Ohio (Dale Glendenning, John Hovanec, Joe Leuty, Jeff & Linda Maxwell), and Pennsylvania (Mary Ann & Tod Pike, Jim Frustieri, Ron Barth). These dealers fill most of the border of the Spyglass Hill Recreation Center, leaving room for three 8-foot tables in the center of the room for attendees to eat lunch at. The result is a cozy atmosphere at the show and plenty of time to see all the sales tables and still have time to socialize. In fact, the show pretty much shut down from about 11:40 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for lunch and a club meeting. Unfortunately heavy snow coming from the west before the show and proceeding east near the end of the show left many dealers at home rather than risk the blowing snows across the emptiness of Northern Illinois or slippery roads in Ohio and Pennsylvania.

As the 20th year of the swap meet, the occasion was more special than usual. Sharon made some delicious chili for those who braved the cold. Dale Glendenning made it to the show but few others. When I saw Glen at the Crown Point show, he indicated the walk-in crowd was less than 10 people. I hoped there might be a few pictures posted somewhere despite the small crowd but I have not seen any yet. Maybe next year I'll be able to make it.

I've always enjoyed the show. One year I bought a collection in the parking lot that included a number of foreign insulators. The owner of the collection said they came from his father who traveled around the world but who had died recently. When I was selling aqua insulators to Tommy Bolack for his aqua mound, I would generally come back from the show with a truckload of pieces to add to the pallet loads I sent him. I would pay 25 cents each for the aqua insulators, cherry pick a couple (such as the C.D. & P. TEL. CO. CD 121s that were common in the neighborhood of some attending collectors), and send the rest to Tommy, making about 50 cents per insulator if I could ship 3000 or more at a time to keep the transportation costs down. Another year, I made a huge deal to get a CD 169 Hemingray Type 1 insulator. The last time I attended, I got to hold in my hand Mary Ann Pikes mint CD 1025 spool.

2019 Price Guide Deal

The new insulator price guide will be published soon. I plan on buying enough to get a quantity discount and plan on passing some of the savings on. Post Show Report

Attending a swap meet or show can be exhausting. Travel times especially during poor road conditions can make returning from a show stressful. Time changes on the way to or home from a show throw a person's body clock out of synch. Moving insulators into and out of a show hall put a physical strain on the body. Here are two tales of such exhaustion.

By early afternoon, Riley Armstrong was on the road heading back to Vermillion, South Dakota. Heading east from Crown Point, Indiana he was traveling straight into the oncoming snowstorm. At 4:12 p.m. the next day, I finally heard from Riley via a text indicating he had just

arrived home to rain. By then the roads were almost all salted so the driving was safer but his hands were "fuzzy from the road vibrations" and he was pretty tired.

Rick Soller left the show about 3:30 p.m. on Saturday and had clear weather until he crossed into Illinois. I-294 around Chicago was clear even with the snow because of all the traffic but four dump trucks were being driven side-by-side at 40 miles per hour as they dumped sand on the road. He had to drop some Hemingray bottles and lamps at Bob Stahr's house on the way back so headed west at one point and encountered worsening roads. As he got closer and closer to Bob's house, the roads got progressively worst since plows had not been n the residential areas yet. The poor road conditions resulted in a quick drop of Bob's boxes and on to home before the roads got worse. As he headed north and east, the road conditions wer manageable but heavy traffic and fearful drivers kept most drivers rolling along at 40 mile4s per hour. With each mile driven it seemed the GPS estimation of the estimated arrival time remained unchanged. After two or three minutes of driving, finally the drive time would drop a minute. What would normally take 1.5 hours to get home took 3.

Sleep is a great cure for fatigue. After getting to bed an hour early, sleeping an hour longer, and taking two 1 hour naps, Rick finally recovered from the demands of the day before.
