A Big Free Collection

On Thursday, May 16 at 2:20:41 p.m., Mike Hawker posted a message on insulators.info that stated, "My entire collection, assembled in the 1970s, is available for the taking." Shortly after that, I emailed him and wrote, "I will take it." By 3:07 p.m. he emailed back that I was the first to reply and that, "It's all yours." He also indicated that the collection was at his mom's in Manchester, Iowa and consisted of possibly upwards of 15-20 boxes with some up in a loft. I then let him know I would be in the area on May 30 and 31 and could get the collection then. After Mike talked to his mother, he let me know that would work and gave me his mother's phone number and address to make final arrangements.

I planned to get there at 3 p.m. on Thursday, May 30 but the excitement about what might be in the collection got me up very early and quickly on the road so that I had to kill some time in antique stores and eating lunch so I wasn't rudely early. Nevertheless, a text from her indicated I could come earlier if I was able so by 2:30 p.m. I was pulling into her driveway.

All the insulators were in a garage across from her house. She was going to sell the house soon so the son who lives in Alaska, had to get the insulators out of there before the move. Mike's brother and a neighbor had already started bringing insulators down from the loft when I backed up to the garage which was great since I didn't look forward to the physical labor of carrying 30 pound boxes down a ladder in 80 degree plus heat. In fact, they did all the work bringing the insulators down while I climbed into the back of my truck and packed the insulators.

Right away I was worried about the quality of the collection since all I could see were CD 147s, CD 145s, and Hemingray-42s. Eventually, some good insulators were spotted and I hoped buried in the boxes were some gems. Unfortunately, I didn't have time to look for treasures as I was focused on getting the boxes loaded.

While handling a few boxes, I found ants streaming out of the sides so a few of the containers were reboxed. This gave me a chance to see what else was in the collection. Right away I was delighted to find several nice pieces including a couple Mickey Mouse insulators, a CD 175, and a CD 258 Cable.

With all the boxes from the loft in my truck and room remaining, I thought I could take a break. Then Mike's brother said there were more boxes under a work bench. That's were another 15-20 boxes were stored. I had not piled the boxes to the ceiling of my truck so that I could see out the back but now had to restack everything to the ceiling plus fill up the seats behind the driver's seat and fill up the front passenger seat. Somehow everything fit and I was off to the show.

I kept about 50 pieces from the collection and put the rest in the club auction. My favorite pieces were two CD 145 H.G.CO. // PETTICOAT insulators in jade, several CD 152 Brookfields in shades of green, a couple CD 147s with different embossing errors, and several different CD 156.1 Whitall-Tatums in different colors.

Saturday, June 1, 2019 Tama, Iowa Show Report

The 22nd Annual Hawkeye State Insulator Swap Meet held at the Tama Civic Center is in the history books now. The event once again maintained its standard of excellence in socialization, food, and insulators.

My socialization began on Thursday before the show. I picked up such a large and free collection on the way to the show that there wasn't any reason to go antiquing for the rest of the day since there wasn't any room in my truck for additional purchases and I needed time to go through the collection before the show. As a result, after I loaded the Manchester, Iowa collection on Thursday afternoon, I headed straight to my hotel in Tama. Dave Shaw wasn't home so I spent a couple hours with his across-the-street neighbor, Tom Murphy, who helped me find some boxes that weren't ant infested and to look through the collection with me. I'm glad he helped me because he found some pieces I would have overlooked such as a CD 106 [250] Hemingray No. 9 in a yellow green and a couple clear CD 160 [020] H.G.CO. // PETTICOAT insulators with a smooth base in clear.

On Friday morning, I helped Dave Shaw set up the show hall and spent time organizing the truckload of insulators for the auction. I spent a lot of time doing this as I also tried to create a record of every insulator since most were found in Iowa. I wanted to know what insulators were used in Iowa. I eventually had to give up on doing this because I ran out of time. The auction netted \$1507 so the buyer's premium netted the show host \$150 to help pay for the show hall and food.

Friday evening a big group of collectors made the trek to the local casino and enjoyed the extensive buffet. I remember laughing and joking a lot and the time spent there was dragged out to enjoy the company as much as possible. After two hours, however, we all went our separate ways to meet up in the morning at the show.

As shown in the picture below, the show hall was well lighted and filled with dealers. There was easy access through the door at one end of the hall which did not involve any steps.



There were a couple notable memories I have of the show. The first item sold in the auction went for \$27. Russ Frank remarked that he had the walking stick for sale for \$10 but no one expressed an interest so he was surprised it went for so much in the auction. I had lunch with a couple that were new collectors and lived on a farm. It was fun to talk to people just starting out in the hobby. Another new collector at the show was Ephraim who lives in Michigan City, a few miles from Robert Winkler, so I called Robert up and put the two of them in contact. Dennis Weber had a beautiful CD 127.4 [Hemingray] for sale on his table that I added to my collection and Dave Shaw had a mint CD 293 gray purple Locke that also went home with me. I have had a chance to buy the CD 293 many times but have always held out for a mint one. I'm glad one finally came along. Andy Wadysz said he would have bought it if I did not and Dave remarked that he originally bought it from Andy.
