## GCIC Swap Meet in Ottawa, Illinois

**Tom and Mary Nugent** hosted a wonderfully successful swap meet for members of the Greater Chicago Insulator Club on Saturday, September 14, 2019. The swap meet was held at their home in Ottawa, Illinois and included great weather, delicious food, perfect accommodations, warm friendships, and incredible insulator transactions.

The show was held a week later than when it was hosted in Racine, Wisconsin one week after Labor Day by noted speed boat racer, **Randy Wesner** (You can see his racing skill at <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oNLA91jDaGY</u> or by going to YouTube and typing in "Randy drives a 250 cc hydroplane). The change in date allowed Tom to attend the Sandwich County Fair the week before. The change also allowed **Jason Townsend** to make the swap meet.

I picked up **Greg North** on my way to the show and then made a detour to visit **Robert Winkler** in Michigan City, Indiana. I picked up some insulators from Robert and then headed west for Ottawa, arriving at 5 p.m. Greg and I shared a hotel room on Friday night. After checking in, we popped over to Tom & Mary's house to check out Tom's collection and chat with other collectors. We left a couple hours later, had dinner, and hit the hay so we could get up early and get to the swap meet before anyone else. Nevertheless, several collectors beat us to the show.

Some terrific insulators showed up. **Jason Townsend** brought a recently purchased collection that had collectors swarming his table. I managed to nab a CD 196 H.G.Co. that was in a sage color with a little purple swirling in the dome plus a battery rest with an unlisted embossing (pictures on next page). Finds like this are why I get to as many shows as I can. A few hours into the swap meet, Jason and I negotiated a price for what was left of the collection and I took home a very full truck of insulators since I also bought a box or so of insulators from **Mark Gilmore** so he didn't take anything home from his sales stock (as far as I know).

I also picked up a CD 102 Harloe (Hawley) with the embossing twisted to the left. In the last year and a half, I've acquired three insulators like this. The one from the Ottawa swap meet had the most extreme distortion. Besides another CD 102, I also have a CD 112 like this.

The auction ran smoothly now that dozens of them have been held over the years at a variety of shows. When I arrived on Saturday morning, **Tom Nugent** already had his lots in boxes and lined up on tables. **Mike McLaughlin** had his auction lots already lined up too.

The auction was a little smaller than usual in terms of sales but featured a large number of bidders and a good number of sellers. The auction resulted in \$676 being exchanged for 83 lots of insulators. This netted the club \$68 in commissions added to the \$9 in donations of auction items. Thirty bidders registered for the auction and eight collectors sold items in the auction. Although the top lot sold for \$63 which consisted in a variety of glass insulators, most lots sold in the \$1 to \$10 range. Results are shown below.
