

Western Reserve Insulator Club (WRIC) Zoom Show

Usually the Western Reserve Insulator Club has a show in Richfield, Ohio which is south of Cleveland. The show is their Oktoberfest event. This year, however, the show was cancelled due to coronavirus concerns, but the club had a meeting/swap meet via Zoom on September 26 instead that went from 9 a.m. until noon (Eastern time). Since I am a member of the WRIC too, I learned about the event, got a link to it, and logged on promptly at 8 a.m. Chicago time with a few insulators ready to sell hoards of collectors with limited options to buy insulators.

The set-up of Zoom is conducive to events like this. A person can join from the comforts of their home and can do so with a desk-top computer, a laptop, a smart phone, or other mobile devices such as an iPad. John Hovanek, the host of the meeting, indicated in setting up the meeting, that dealers and nondealers could be switched to private breakout meeting rooms to chat or negotiate for insulators for sale.

Unfortunately, the attendance was sparse and the willingness to buy anything was nearly non-existent. Only four people logged on initially. Eventually, attendees included me (Rick Soller), John Hovanek, Sharon Foster, Curtis Erickson, Steve Bobb, Bernie & Rick Baldwin, someone named Ryan, and one other person. I didn't sell anything and neither did John. I was the only one who bought anything from the only other dealer, Steve Bobb and that only include a pole nail, a porcelain lightning rod insulator with bracket, and a metallic light tan Pittsburg beehive.

There was interesting conversation, however. The highlight for me was hearing about Rick Baldwin's collection of glass turtles. I wondered how he could be confident in knowing what company made some of them. He said it was mostly guessing based on where the turtle was found or the color. For one of his turtles, however, there was no question about what company made it. It was partially made in the mold for a Hemingray-107 CD 1070 spool. I also asked about the price range for these and learned that he has bought them for anywhere from \$20 to hundreds. I can't image how much the one made in the Hemingray-107 mold would go for in an insulator auction!

During lulls in the conversation, John Hovanek showed pictures of past shows and several attendees chimed in with memories of the show. I saw pictures of a swap meet at the former home of Curtis Erickson, the show in Washington, Pennsylvania near the Ohio border, and shows in West Leechburg, Pennsylvania.

I assumed that most of the people logged into the meeting would attend the Mid-Ohio show but was surprised to learn that was not the case. Ryan, John Hovanek & Sharon Foster, and Rick and Bernie Baldwin stated that were not going. Tables are sold out for the show, but I wonder if the walk-through crowd will be smaller than some people (e.g., Jason Townsend) think. It will be interesting to see.

Ottawa, IL Swap Meet Report

Up until the day before, I didn't think the GCIC swap meet in Ottawa, Illinois would happen due to the coronavirus. Nevertheless, lots of dealers attended, lots of insulator-related items were sold in the auction, and a good time was enjoyed. Tom had tables well-spaced, so social distancing was easy plus the service of food was conducted to minimize any spread of the virus. Throughout the show, I never saw anyone without a face mask. Kudos to everyone.

It seemed like there were a record number of lots in the auction. The sheets with the auction results stretched to nine pages and about 112 lots were recorded as being sold. Thirty-one bidders signed up for bidder numbers with commissions on the auction and donations netting \$125 which was turned over to Tom Nugent to help pay for food and advertising expenses.

A new system was used to run the auction. Bidders were asked to sit in chairs spaced far apart or stand apart from each other. Lot numbers were assigned to each item or group of items and bidders were admonished not to move things from one box to another. Gene Hawkins was recruited to handle record-keeping. Mike McLaughlin and one other person helped display items up for bid and deliver them to the winning bidder.

I thought Tom Nugent had sold everything he wanted to get rid of in last year's auction, but he managed to put together about 30 lots for this auction and earn a nice amount from his efforts. 13 other people had items in the auction.

Results of the auction are shown below. Because lot numbers were used, some lots were sold out of order, and some lots didn't have a lot number so letters were used. There might be errors in the information below since bidder numbers were converted to bidder names and I had to figure out Gene's abbreviations and handwriting in one or two cases ②. If this method is used again, there will be some refinements.
