

The area in and around Rochester is loaded with interesting things to see and do, so why not plan your vacation around the show? Your non-collector spouse will love you for it! We hope to see you all at the National Show, and urge you to also support the local nnd regional shows in your area.

Guess what it's time for? Bids for the National Show (Western Region) as well as the Central and Eastern Shows for 1984! We have all three of our major shows for 1983, but it was by the skin of our teeth, and it would sure be nice this year if we could have all three bids in by April 1st, '83 as there supposed to be. This is so they can be approved by the Board and announced at the NIA General Business meeting in Rochester for the coming year. Do some honest soul searching, please, and then turn those show bids in to Kevin Lawless, our Executive director.

On to another subject: John de Sousa's term as Eastern Region V.P. will be up in July, '83, and we need to start thinking about possible candidates to fill that position. Remember that to be a candidate you must live in that Region, and that a ballot will be sent to only those NIA Members also residing in the Eastern Region, and it will be attached to the March issue of Drip Points. If you would like to serve in this position or know of anyone who would, names may be turned in to me or Mel Shootman, our Nominating Committee Chairman.

As a point of interest, were you aware that the Senior (or first V.P. as he is sometimes called) V.P. is the one who steps in to take over in case anything should happen to the President or if he must be absent for any reason?

These are a couple of announcements: The list of insulator refferences, books and publications that is normally mailed to each new NIA Member, has now been completely updated, new books added, books deleted (if no longer available), new book prices and postage rates, etc. These make good handouts at local shows too and would be such a help to a new collector who may have come to the show, but isn't yet an NIA member. Let me know if you need some. Also don't forget that you may include your show fliers in Drip Points — just send them to Mike Bruner, our Information Director.

One more thing: Some suggestions for a couple of changes in our NIA Show Rules have been sent in by members, and after the Board has acted on these, we will let you know what they are in the next issue of Drip Points - due to come out in Mid March.

Will try to fill you in on a few facts and some figures as to our membership, and our financial condition. In this department it is still hurry - hurry, but as of this writing, we now have 1034 NIA members --- that is, voting members as well as family members. They keep coming in day by day, and many times the renewals come in because an active member reminds a friend to get those dues in. Just a friendly nudge or reminder is all it sometimes takes, so lets all try to help.

Money wise- our bank balance is standing at \$1,609.13, with about \$45.00 waiting to get to the bank. We just came back from our annual Bakersfield Show, and while there I placed our NIA Patch out on my sales table, and walked around the room, and in just a few minutes I sold six of them. So if you didn't know, I have a good supply of them at \$2.00 each, and we will pay the postage. Getting back to money matters, our biggest expense is Drip Points, and all the postage it takes to get them to you. It took about \$435.00 for our first issue, and it will be about \$250.00 for this one, but it is well worth the cost. When you receive it, don't delay sending in the contract(s), banquet reservations and motel reservation cards.

The banquet menu looks great: a buffet with 4 hot entrees, plus hot vegetable, salads, rolls, beverage and dessert. All you care to eat and for \$10.00 per person. Plus - the Awards, both the formal ones and let's just say, the informal ones.
