

Now to bring you up to date on what's happening:

Your Board of Directors did approve the changes and additions to our NIA Show Rules and Judging Guidelines (as suggested by the three person committee appointed to work on this and present a proposal to the Board). Committee Chairman Grant Salzman explained these in detail to the membership at the Friday night business meeting. However, in deference to Dick Bowman, who had already sent out show packets at the time these changes were being made, they did not go into effect until after the Rochester National, but they will be used from here on in.

Another subject is under discussion by the NIA Board: To enable National Show hosts to put on larger shows; should we allow other collectibles besides insulators and related items, to become a part of our National Insulator Convention? Regional shows have been allowed this privilege for quite some time, and with good results. Several members have asked that we consider this and so I have set up a special committee to study the pros and cons and come up with a recommendation to the Board. Chairman of the committee is Dick Bowman

(1983 Show Host) who will work with John McDougald (1976 Show Host) and Vi Brown (1984 Show Host). Obviously a decision must be reached soon We'll let you know in the Winter issue of Drip Points.

Since our NIA Handbook (containing bylaws and show rules) was last revised in November of 1978, there have been several changes and additions. The Board has decided to update and reprint the Handbook, having it available for mailing out to all new members and membership renewals for the fiscal year 84-85. Editing will be done by By-laws Chairman Jack Tod, past president Pat Patocka and myself. Jack will do it through the typing up, printing and binding. I'm proud to say that some of the money the NIA has realized from the sale of Commemorative Mickey-mouse insulators will be used for this project...

One last point: The NIA has joined the Federation of Historical Bottle Clubs as an affiliate member. We hope for many mutual benefits in the future- sharing of news items, show dates announced, exposure to new members, etc. Remember last spring we became an affiliate member of the National Bottle Museum for the same reasons.

FROM THE TREASURER

The August 31st count of voting members stands at 679 with a total membership including all family members of 1130. The Board certainly appreciates your support and this is a record membership. The latest membership number assigned as of this writing is # 3185.

Someone inquired as to why their membership card had a small hole punched in the lower left hand corner. For a \$6.00 family membership only one person is entitled to a ballot and receives a

membership card without a hole. For an extra \$1.00 per family member, additional ballots are received and the membership card doesn't get punched. Simple, eh?

Our treasury now stands at \$1,770.77 for operating funds and an additional \$1,562.00 in the educational fund aquired from the sale of the NIA 10th Anniversary commemorative insulators. Principal expenditures during the past six months were \$100.00 each for paid advertising to the hosts of the Western and Central Regional shows. Also, \$250.00 was reimbursed to the National Show host for a portion of the paid advertising costs. These reimbursements are an incentive to show hosts to publicize their events.

During the past year, your Ethics Committee has attempted to follow up on various concerns and reports made by various members. As of this time, there is nothing of a factual nature to report. While the rumor mill has been working overtime, people somehow don't want their names used, and this makes it tough, if not impossible, to pin things down.

The Ethics Committee therefore suggests that the following procedure be used when a problem arises. First, take up your complaint directly with the person involved. If the person is unwilling or unresponsive to your concern (i.e.—won't take back the item or make it good, or is involved in activities that you feel would be harmful to the hobby), then the second step is to WRITE the NIA and let us know. It is very important that all concerns and problems be put in writing, as all follow up is usually done on the phone or by letter.

Remember, nothing can be accomplished unless we all pull together.


