

While we are talking about the 2017 National, let me remind everyone that if you are so inclined, it is time for you to send your nominations for the Outstanding Service Award, Lifetime Membership Award and NIA Hall of Fame Award. The nomination forms for each of these can be found on the NIA website at http://www.nia.org/archives/, and must be submitted by April 1st. Please send your nominations to our Awards and Recognition Chairman, Gene Hawkins. His address is located on the inside of the back cover of your Drip Points Magazine.

In a recent Drip Points article I made reference to Elton Gish's donation to the NIA concerning his extensive research. When Elton informed us of his desire to donate his materials, he requested that we make the information only available to the NIA membership. In an effort to accomplish Elton's request, I have asked

our Webmaster and our Immediate Past President to work together to develop a means to achieve this goal. While that may seem simple, it is more complicated than it sounds. However, I am pleased to report that our Webmaster, Bob Berry, has made a couple of suggestions as to how that may be accomplished. The final decision has not been made as to how we will make the materials available to the membership, and there is additional work that needs to be done before we are finished. With all of that said, please know that we are working toward making these documents available to you and will advise you as additional progress is made toward that end.

Changing the subject yet again, I want to congratulate the Development Committee, Mike Green, Lou Hall and Bill Rohde for the spectacular job they have done relative to soliciting and collecting donations. Through their efforts, and your support, 2016 donations were more than doubled over the preceding year. (The Development Chairman, Mike Green, has provided additional details in his article.) I am delighted with the prospects of what can be accomplished in 2017.

As you might imagine, there are many things that are going on behind the scenes. One of those is our effort to update the Membership Handbook. The day prior to writing this article I had a conversation with our attorney to determine what we can and can not do relative to this project. With his council, we now know how to properly approach this work. I have given the various updates to our Rules and Procedures Advisor, Mike Funderburk, and he is in the process of making the corrections to the document so it can be presented to the Board of Directors for their approval. Assuming the updates are approved by the Board, the revised Membership Handbook will be sent to our Webmaster so it can be placed on the NIA website. Please know that the revisions that are being made to the Handbook are primarily the decisions made by the Board of Directors since the last time that the Handbook has been updated. The purpose for updating the Handbook is simply an effort to keep it current.

Finally, with this issue of the Drip Points Magazine we are required to submit candidates for Board of Directors' positions that will be up for election in 2017. Those positions are the Western Vice President and the Treasurer. The Chairman of the Nominating Committee, Ron Yuhas, has informed me that we have one candidate for each of these positions. Our Membership Handbook states that "When the Nominating Committee is unable to present a slate of candidates to the membership because only one candidate is willing to be nominated and elected by ballot, the new officers will take office by acclamation upon a duly adopted resolution of the Board of Directors." However, like last year, I would prefer to give the membership the opportunity to vote. Therefore, in your Drip Points Magazine you will find a ballot for you to cast your vote. When you vote please

note that all primary members may cast a vote for the Treasurer position; however, only primary members in the Western Region may cast a vote for the Western VP position. Also, please note that all votes cast must be received by the NIA Secretary, Walt Baumgardt, on or before May 1st, 2017. So, please don't delay. Please send your votes to him as soon as you receive your ballot. The Secretary's address is located on the inside of the back cover of your Drip Points Magazine.

In closing let me encourage you to get out and go to a show, exercise your right as an NIA member and cast your vote, and to borrow a quote from Tim Baggett, "collect what you enjoy and enjoy what you collect".

I was introduced to insulator collecting by my grandfather and my uncle in the early seventies in North Carolina. With the constant support of my parents, Rosemary and Stephen, I obtained and used Tibbitts' books for reference. I actually had the opportunity to meet John Tibbitts some years later at his "Little Glass Shack" near Sacramento, California. Early on, I traded bottles that I dug for insulators that I liked. Later, I hunted insulators at every opportunity across the eastern United States, Prince Edward Island, Spain, Portugal, Italy and Turkey. I attended many eastern and western region shows including Holyoke, Kulpsville, Perkiomenville, Enumclaw, Merritt, Cache Valley, Auburn, Cayucos, Moro Bay, Three Amigos, Porterville, D&D, Albuquerque, Medford, Seven Feathers, Spudfest, Big Sky, Yuma, Chico, Roseville, Anderson, Victorville, Rhode Ranch, Reno/Sparks, and a few club swaps as a member of the Chesapeake Bay, Jefferson State, Norcal, and Grand Canyon State Insulator Clubs. I served the NIA as co-host for the Williamsburg, VA. National. I served as the awards coordinator for a San Jose, CA. regional and show committee member for two San Jose Nationals. I served as the western region correspondent for the hobby journal CJOW for a number of years under the Left Coast Lines masterhead and I am still a frequent contributor to the hobby press through both Drip Points and CJOW. As of the end of last year, we had 1637 National Insulator Association members. As of right now, we have 1372. That's down 235 members from last year, or almost 15%. Never fear, though, as it's just the start of the year and I'm sure a fair number of folks have yet to renew. The last round of reminders will be going out shortly.

But that does bring up an interesting point. This year, the cutoff date for joining the NIA prior to the National is going to be June 18, 2017. That's a rather unusual length of time before the show, but necessary due to my circumstances. I am not, unfortunately, going to be able to make the National show this year in Colorado Spring, CO, on July 20-23. And I'm not going to be able to update the NIA membership information for about a month before the show. What that means is that if your renewal gets to me after June 18, I won't be able to get you added to the list of members, used at the door to verify your membership. Which in turn means that you would have to pay (again) at the door to become a member. We certainly don't intend to charge you twice -- if that happens, we will credit your extra payment to your 2018 membership. It would be far better, though, if we don't run into that situation. So don't wait -- be sure to renew your membership early! I will be reminding folks of this on a monthly basis on ICON and Facebook, but please don't put it off. If you know anyone who hasn't renewed, please pass along the reminder so that they don't get surprised.

In spite of knowing I'll miss the National show (or maybe also because I know I'm not going to be there), now is a good time to turn my thoughts to the new year's insulator season. Being in the north of the Eastern Region, I'm looking forward to the CBIC show in Shrewsbury, PA on March 11; the YPCIC show in Enfield, CT on April 2; maybe I can find my way to the OVIC show in Perth, ON on April 15; the WRIC show in West Leechburg, PA on April 29; the GVBCA Bottle Show in Rochester, NY on April 30; Claude Wambold's backyard show in Perkomenville,

PA on June 10; and the ICA Expo in Washington, PA on June 23 and 24. I always do my best to get to as many shows as I can, and knowing I'm going to miss "the big one" is good incentive to try to get to as many of the others as possible. It's always enjoyable to get the opportunity to see friends old and new, while maybe picking up something for the collection. If you are going to any of the above shows and have some baby signals to sell, be sure to bring them along!

Turning to some fun with numbers, I was thinking a bit about member retention. Every year, we have new members who join the NIA, but who never join again after that first and only year. The numbers bounce around a bit over the years, with a high of 114 members who joined in 1991 who haven't been members since. The low was in 2007, when only 31 members joined who haven't come back. It would be interesting to hear from folks if anyone has any ideas on why these "one-time members" never joined again. Any thoughts?

On the other end of the spectrum, there were 885 charter members of the NIA (Charter Member numbers 1 - 620 were assigned in 1973, and numbers 621 to 886 were assigned in 1974). Of those, 114 are known to have passed away over the years. The number is likely higher than that, unfortunately, but there is no official mechanism to keep track of this. Over time, the number of charter members who have

kept up their membership has gradually declined. In 1980, there were 257 charter members still active. In 1990 there were 141, in 2000 there were 120, and in 2010 there were 105. As of 2017, there are currently 75 active Charter Members. Of the Charter Members who have renewed for 2017, it is interesting to note how many years of membership they have.

Typically these discs come in light blue and occasionally brown. The white unit is a exciting new discovery. They have the blue ink markings found on the standard blue discs.

I am pleased to report that the Development Committee more than doubled the NIA donations from the previous year. Most of the contributions came at the Muncie National and during membership renewal. In total \$4860.00 was raised for the NIA. Of that total \$2620.00 was general NIA donation, \$920.00 toward the scholarship fund, \$370.00 toward National shows, \$245.00 to the education fund, and \$705.00 for Internet development. I can't begin to express the thanks and appreciation I feel for your generosity. Our future is made brighter by your kindness and support. Our hobby deals with such unique and beautiful collectible items that were key in the development of communication and power throughout the world. The National Insulator Association works to preserve and enrich the hobby through education, shows, marketing, and research. Without your help all these efforts would be much more difficult.

I wish to sincerely thank my committee members Bill Rhode and Lou Hall for the hard work they put forth in making 2016 such a successful year. Both are long time veterans of the hobby who have contributed so much. 

Founded in 1894, the Akron Insulator and Marble Company operated until early 1904 when it joined with the Colonial Sign Company to become Colonial Sign and Insulator Company. However, in that less than a decade span, Akron Insulator and Marble Company produced a number of stoneware house wiring insulators which range from uncommon to very rare. Embossed either A.I. & M. CO. or STANDARD, these cleats and tubes are unusual relics from a bygone era in house wiring. While Standard marked tubes can be found from time to time, A.I. &

M. Co. tubes seem to be much scarcer, while Standard marked cleats are all but impossible to find. The come with large or small font embossing, and other than a set of each in Elton Gish's collection, there are one or two other Standard marked cleats running around, making them one of the rarest insulators in the hobby. If you come across any insulators with Standard, or A. I. & M. CO. embossing, they should be considered important early relics of the porcelain insulator industry from the dawn of early home electrification.




